What can standards help with?

Starting point:

Unsustainable products = market failure to be rectified through policy

- Objectives of product policies:
- 1. Grant market access to better/greener products [Supply]
- 2. Empower procurers/public to make more informed choices [Demand]
- → Standards: tool that can support both policy objectives
- Standards can be:
- 1. Sets of sustainability criteria (e.g. soil erosion)
- Methods to measure substances (e.g. bio-based content)
- Guidance on communication of product characteristics (e.g. claims)





What should be done?

Standards that enable to:

- 1. Compare bio-based products with conventional products
- 2. Be more comprehensive than biomass production:









Outcome:

- → Increased understanding of environmental benefits, hence more support (procurers and the public, policy makers, NGOs, ...)
- Easier to put in place policies incentivising/penalising certain products over other ones both on supply and demand sides
- 💙 <u>..</u>. Market uptake !







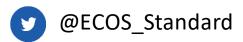
